# 1: Building Energy Use & Renewables

Buildings consume on average more energy than any other feature of town life, meaning they are among the major contributors to climate change. As a community, it is important that we explore ways to improve the energy efficiency of our homes and businesses and also move away from fossil fuels like gas and propane. Contact the Gunnison Valley GV-Heat program to learn how you can make your home more energy efficient. GCEA provides rebates for installing new energy efficient equipment, and many options to purchase your electricity from renewable energy sources.

# Reduce your energy use

- + Perform an energy audit on your home and business to identify the retrofits with the most energy-saving gains (<a href="http://gvrha.org/gv-heat/">http://gvrha.org/gv-heat/</a>), and educate yourself on how to reduce your daily electricity usage (Click <a href="https://example.com/heat/">HERE</a>).
- + Switch all your lights to LED bulbs.
- + Avoid phantom energy: unplug all unused electronics and small appliances.
- + Seal your windows, and weather strip your doors.
- + Lower your thermostat temperature in the winter, and install a programmable thermostat.
- + Look for the energy star label when buying new appliances for your home or business.
- + Tune up your HVAC system to ensure connections are tightened, parts are properly lubricated and coils are cleaned.

## **Building Energy Use & Renewables Continued**

#### Be water aware

- + Wash clothes in cold or warm water (not hot) and run only full loads.
- + Install low-flow showerheads and fixtures. A low-flow showerhead uses half the gallons per minute!
- + Check your pipes, toilets, and faucets for leaks.
- + Take shorter showers and do not fill up your bathtub all the way.
- + Only run your dishwasher when it is full.
- + Turn off the water when brushing your teeth, shaving, or cleaning vegetables.
- + If you have irrigation, make sure there are no breaks in your lines, that you are only watering as needed, and that your irrigation spray heads are hitting the desired areas.
- + Water lawn as needed. Plant native drought resistant trees, shrubs, and flowers.

- + Mulch around trees, shrubs, and plants to slow the evaporation of moisture.
- + Do not use a hose to clean your driveway, sidewalk, and steps-- utilize a broom.
- + Discourage your children from playing with the hose and sprinklers.

### 2: Waste Reduction

The average Colorado resident throws away about 8 lbs of trash per day which is more than 1.45 tons per person each year. While the national recycling rate is at 35%, Colorado drags behind at 12%. However, recycling is not a long-term solution. As a community, we need to *reduce* our waste, utilize what we can *reuse*, and *refuse* anything that does not align with our commitment to sustainability and the curtailment of our GHG emissions. Consider these small, yet impactful changes that will reduce your carbon footprint and emissions.

### Say no to single-use waste items

- + Bring your own coffee mug, water bottle, tupperware, and reusable bag when you know you could encounter a single-use item. Say no to single-use straws!
- + Make or utilize reusable produce bags versus plastic bags (sold at Mountain Earth)
- + Didn't bring your own reusable grocery bag? No problem! There are free bags at Clark's and Mountain Earth. Check out Sustainable CB's Boomerang Bag locations as well.

# Consider the impact of your purchases

- + Instead of buying brand new, consider secondhand and refurbished options.
- + Rethink your online purchases:

Do I really need this?
How far is this coming?
What is the environmental impact?

+ Support local businesses and artisans to reduce distribution emissions, and to invest in the community versus large corporations.

# Eat for a climate stable planet

- + Eat more meat-free, plant-based meals.
- + Buy organic if it is accessible to you. Click <u>HERE</u> for a list of the most important foods to eat organic.
- + Do not waste food or buy more than you can consume and buy local produce and products whenever possible.
- + Invest in a composting system/services (Click <u>HERE</u> to learn about composting at home)
- + Grow your own food or support a local CSA
- + Support food brands and companies that use minimal-to-no packaging.

### Go paperless

- + Switch your bills over to paperless. Unsubscribe to those magazines and junk mail lists (Click <u>HERE</u>)
- + Opt for the emailed receipt or no receipts. (Click <u>HERE</u> to learn why)
- + Request digital versions at the workplace. Print off materials only if necessary and make sure to at least print double sided.
- + Utilize recycled paper or alternate types of paper (Click <u>HERE</u>)

# 3: Transportation

In Crested Butte, transportation accounts for 21% percent of climate-polluting emissions, and the transportation sector is where GHG emissions are rising the fastest. We can actively and effectively cut these rising emissions by consciously making decisions to take the bus, bike, walk, or drive to your destination with family or friends. If you are in the market for a new vehicle, consider an electric vehicle. Charging stations are available and growing within Crested Butte and regionally. The many ways to reduce your transportation emissions will also make you healthier, happier and save you money!
